

Myoko Kogen is one of Japan's oldest ski areas, combining several ski resorts—four of which are accessible with a single lift ticket. It is renowned for having some of the best ski runs in Japan, including its longest run, which stretches 8.5 km. Steeped in history and culture, the resort offers an authentic Japanese experience. Conveniently located just 2.5 hours from Tokyo.

## Ski terrain

From long, scenic, tree-lined slopes to challenging bump runs—and especially deep powder. The best months for skiing the Myoko Ski Resorts tend to be in January and February, although great snowfall can extend anywhere between November and May! With terrain parks for those who live for the challenge of winter sports along with some sweet tree runs and side country.

#### Akakura Onsen

There are three main areas to the Akakura Onsen resort and is interconnected with the neighbouring Akakura Kanko. With 80% of its runs groomed conditions, it's ideal for beginner-intermediates. This is the only ski resort to offer night skiing and the resort has terrain parks, back country skiing and child-friendly areas.

#### Akakura Kanko

Connected to Akakura Onsen. this resort offers a variety of runs for all levels of skiers. Intermediate and advanced skiers can find more challenging runs higher on the mountain. It also has a kids park and was one of the first ski resorts in Japan. True ski-in, ski-out experience with a mid-mountain hotel. New gondola 2024/25.

## Myoko Suginohara

Everything from long cruisy runs, off-piste terrain, steep bump trails, to Japan's longest run (8.5km). It also offers lots of fun runs through the trees and you can even see Mount Fuji on a clear day! Some of the slopes are left ungroomed, which means excellent powder conditions. It also has a terrain park and is family-friendly.
