Norquay delivers local charm, quick laps, and family-friendly fun.

With the SkiBig3 Lift Ticket, explore everything from steep chutes and wide bowls to mellow glades and cruisers, plus enjoy a free shuttle to wherever the snow calls. Getting There

Sit back, relax, and soak in the mountain views with a stunning shuttle ride from Calgary International Airport—just 1.5 hours (145km) to Banff or 2 hours (190km) to the breathtaking Lake Louise.

Shopping, Dining & Après

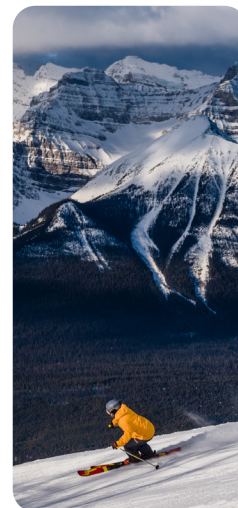
