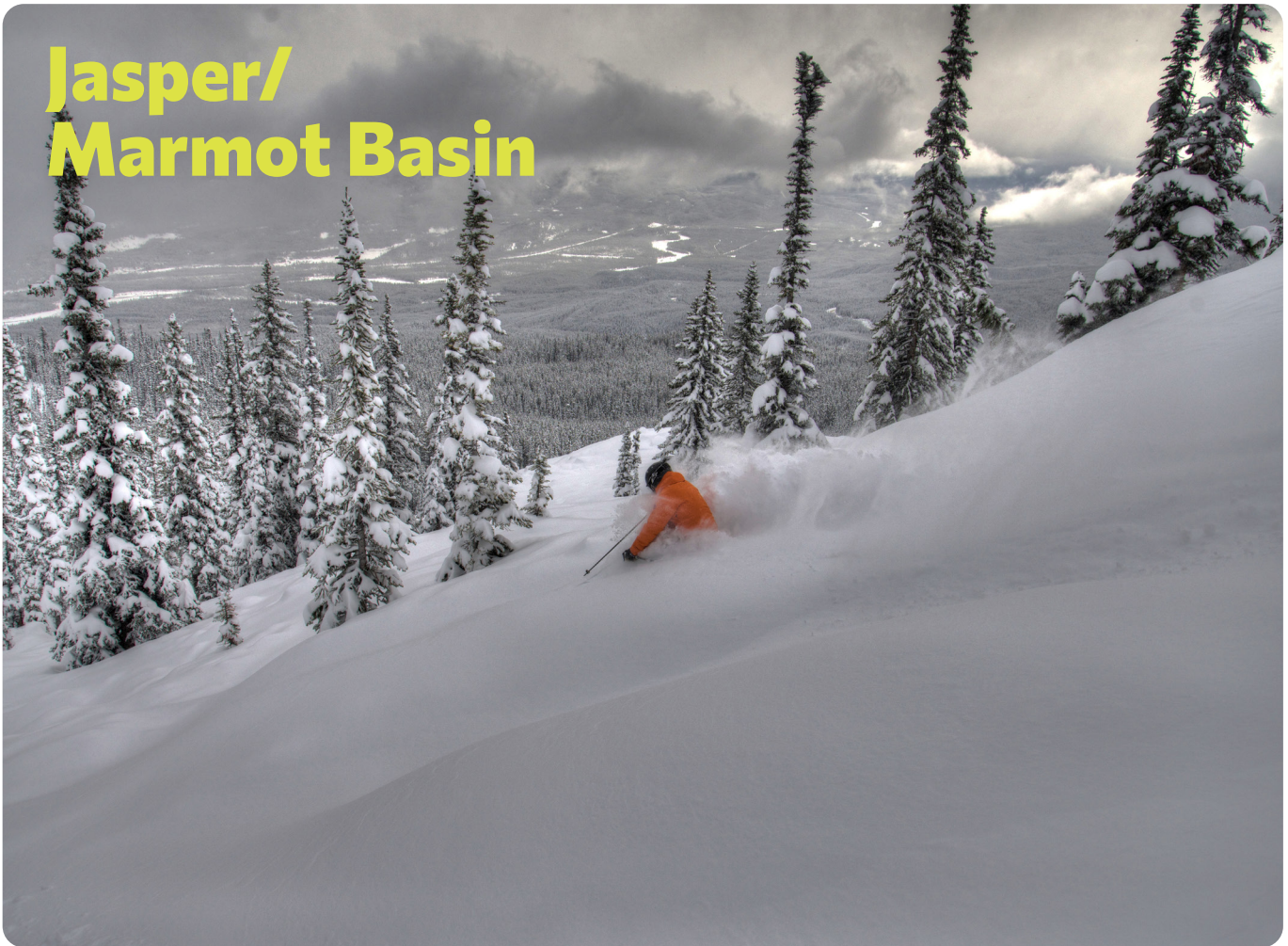

Uncrowded, Unhurried & Laid-Back

Just 20 km from Jasper, Marmot Basin offers easy access via shuttle and a warm, welcoming mountain town vibe. Skiers and riders of all levels can explore five mountain faces with long groomers, tree runs, high alpine bowls, and steep chutes, all filled with dry, Rocky Mountain powder. With Canada's highest base elevation and minimal lift lines, the snow stays great and the pace relaxed.

After the slopes, return to Jasper, a laid-back town in the heart of Jasper National Park, where locals are always happy to share a story. It's a world-class winter escape with small-town charm and big-mountain adventure.

Getting There

Jasper's Marmot Basin Ski Resort is a 3.5 hour shuttle or drive from Calgary International Airport (426 km).
